APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to Dentistry is very competitive in Canada.

The admissions committee also assesses non-academic qualities, including compassion, reliability, responsibility, interpersonal.

Basic requirements:

- A Bachelor Degree (in any academic area) with 80% GPA GPA of accepted students is 88% – 96%
- Reference letters from professors
- A personal essay
- Dental Aptitude Test (DAT)
- An interview
- Volunteer or Paid Work experience in a hospital or medical clinic
